# Gary Hansen responses Candidate for Black Gold School Division Trustee Ward 3

#### 1. Curriculum

On April 22, 2021, the Black Gold School Division released a position paper called, <u>Black Gold Draft Curriculum Review Summary Report</u>. It summarised the findings of the School Division in regard to the proposed curricula and in regard to the piloting of it. The Report can be found on the Back Gold School Division web site.

I support the Black Gold School Board's decision not to pilot the proposed curricula. I also believe that the move forward on the development of new curricula should involve public education stakeholders. This should be the path forward when this assignment is redone.
