Why does labour education matter?

AUPE courses help ensure union members like you are trained and willing to take a stand for public services, decent jobs and fairness in the workplace and community. University programs foster skills like critical-thinking, creativity, and effective communication. They also help you gain greater understanding of the economic, political and legal contexts confronting workers and unions.



Why should I continue my union education at university?

AUPE's credit transfer agreements offer you several benefits:

- Choose from options perfectly suited for people who require flexible or part-time study, online or in-person, self-paced or scheduled

What is credit transfer, and how does it work?

Credits are the recognition post-secondary schools give to students for completing courses, and a way of measuring hours required to graduate. The hours you spend in AUPE's classrooms can be assessed for university credits, or to have certain program requirements waived. Transferring credits opens up pathways for learners like you.



I'm ready! How do I transfer credit?

Enroll in one of the three eligible university programs and begin studying. When you are ready to request an assessment of your AUPE course hours for university credit, please contact AUPE's registrar (registrar@aupe.org) or Jordan Thompson, Union Representative in Education (j.thompson@aupe.org). For general advice or support regarding continuing education, please also contact the Education Department.



What is "Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition," or PLAR?

PLAR is another way you may be able to get university credit, but it is different than credit transfer. With PLAR, you complile a portfolio of your informal learning (which may include your union training, life experiences, work, etc.), and you earn credits for a process of reflection and writing about them. Check with the school you want to study at to see if they offer PLAR.
